The goal is for these activities also to be taken up by youth leaders inspired by and supported by Juliette (supported mainly through online education and training).</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Public speaking at schools, conferences, and public events to promote awareness of elephant welfare issues. • Media interviews • Providing an Education & Training section of the JulietteSpeaks website to give youth the tools they need to succeed in becoming effective animal advocates. • Launching and coordinating a “global youth against the ivory trade” school club program to support youth in becoming leaders in stopping the ivory trade in their own countries. • Advocating for the passage of local, national, and international legislation that protects wild and captive elephants. • Reaching out to circus, zoo and tourism offenders and educating them about how and why they should change their treatment of elephants. • Promoting the development of alternative forms of education and entertainment that don't harm elephants. • Contributing to the purchase of captive elephants and their delivery to sanctuaries. • Advocating for the release of specific “worst case” elephants in zoos or circuses. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Increased public awareness of the cruelty inflicted on captive elephants. • Decreased public support of activities involving captive elephants. • Increased number of elephants that are released to sanctuaries. • Increased public awareness that wild elephants are slaughtered for the ivory trade and are in danger of extinction. • Decreased trade in ivory and decrease in killing of elephants. • Increased youth leadership for promoting elephant welfare and protection. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Elimination of the slaughter of elephants for the ivory trade. • Resurgence of healthy population of wild African elephants. • Elimination of the use of captive elephants for human entertainment and education. • Eco-tourism is a financially viable and widely popular alternative to zoos, circuses and elephant trekking.
